Co-Production Partnership database

The Co-Production Partnership is setting up a database.

A database is a computer programme which stores information. You can then find the information you need easily.

This will allow us to know what topics people might be interested in.

If staff from the council or NHS want to talk to people who are interested in a particular topic we will be able to match them with people who are interested in that area.

Neuro-diversity and mainstream services

We are working on a project to find out about the experience of people with neurodivergent conditions when using mainstream services.

Neurodivergent conditions are things like autism, Tourette's syndrome, Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD), dyslexia or dyspraxia.

Mainstream services are those which can be used by everyone in the community. It is things like health services, being able to use sports and leisure services, or how you are treated at the job centre.

People with neurodiverse conditions often find using services aimed at all the community difficult.

We are wanting to find out which services people find easy and difficult.
