


# Improving access to health

	<p>Being able to use the health service is important for everyone. Disabled people don't always find this very easy. The Co-Production Partnership has been looking at how to make health services better for disabled people.</p>
	<p>When we go to hospital, it can be hard to say what we want and need. To help people with this a number of Hospital Passports have been developed.</p> <p>We have found that there are different ones being used for learning disabilities, autism and dementia. We want to find out from people who use Hospital Passports if it would work if there was one document for all groups.</p>
	<p>Members of BAVIP (Bradford Association of Visually Impaired People) are working with the eye team at Bradford Royal Infirmary. They will be getting staff to experience what it is like to move around the hospital with different types of visual impairment.</p>
	<p>Earlier this year we brought together people with different access needs to look at the signs at BRI. People said how the main sign could be made easier to read and understand. We said that the words need to be clear. We also said that having all the information from A to Z was helpful.</p>
	<p>When we are in hospital, staff do not always know that we have extra support needs. We thought that it would be a good idea for people to have an extra wrist band. This will tell staff that you may need extra help or for them to talk to you in a way which is best for you.</p>

# Airedale Hospital rebuild

	<p>In September it was confirmed that Airedale Hospital has been told that they will get the money to get a new building. They need a new hospital building as the current one has been built with a type of concrete that does not last for very long. This means it will need to be replaced soon.</p>
	<p>The new hospital will be on the same site as the current hospital. This is at Steeton, between Keighley and Skipton.</p>
	<p>The current hospital will keep on running in the old building until the new hospital is ready to open.</p>
	<p>Having a new hospital building means that disabled people can say what they need to make sure it is really accessible.</p>
	<p>Listening to what people tell us will help to get this right first time and make sure the hospital meets everyone's needs.</p>
	<p>The new hospital will take a few years to build. It is hoped that it will be finished and ready to see patients in 2030.</p>

	<p>Most people know that it can be difficult to get an appointment with a GP (family doctor). We want to know if there are things which make it even harder for disabled people to get an appointment than other people.</p>
	<p>This is an issue which Bradford Council's Health and Care Committee will be looking at soon,</p>

## Learning disabilities and neurodiversity plans

	<p>The Co-Production Partnership has been working with Bradford District Care Trust (NHS) and Bradford Council.</p>
	<p>We worked together to find out what people with learning disabilities and neurodiverse conditions thought were the important things in the neurodiversity and learning disabilities action plans.</p>
	<p>People thought it was really important that staff who work for the council and NHS know about learning disabilities and neurodiversity. More training for staff is planned and will involve people with learning disabilities and neurodiverse conditions.</p>
	<p>Another important thing for people was being part of a community. This means that community based services will need to have the money to run good services.</p>

Safe and Sound supports people to stay safe and independent in their own home. This service allows disabled and elderly people to let others know if there is a problem, like they have fallen or are stuck.

At the moment people pay some money each week to use the service. The council are wanting to change these costs for some of the people who use it. Some people will pay more. Others will pay less.
